## Heart • 4 June 2023 • Matthew 6:24-34

- 1. What was your first job?
- 2. Read Matthew 6:24-34 together:
  - a. What are the key things that jump out to you?
  - b. How would you sum up Jesus' message? Can you say it in a sentence?
- 3. Have a look at v32.
  - a. What does Jesus say about 'pagans'?
  - b. How do you observe this in the wider world?



- 4. A key theme of the passage is worry.
  - a. What is it about material wealth that most worries you right now?
  - b. What would it look like to trust God in this?
- 5. Money is clearly an important issue in our lives and yet it's not something we talk about very much.
  - a. What would it look like to have healthy conversations about how money is impacting our lives as Jesus' followers?
  - b. Are there things you want other people to check in with you on?





# Head • 11 June 2023 • 1 Chronicles 29:10-16

- 1. What was the first thing you remember saving up money to buy?
- 2. Have a look at 1 Chronicles 29:10-16 together.
  - a. What stands out to you in the passage?
  - b. What do you see as the most important take away?
- 3. Proverbs commands that we 'honour the LORD with our wealth (Prov 3:9).
  - a. Are there things we can spend on or invest in that definitely don't honour the Lord?
  - b. What does honour look like with money?



- 4. If the people in your world copied the way you use money, would that be a good thing? Are there things you feel challenged to change?
- 5. Dave Ramsey wrote: "Tell your money where to go or you'll wonder where it went."
  - a. What are the benefits of budgeting your money?
  - b. Do you set a household budget? Why or why not?
  - c. Are there ways of supporting one another with this?

  - b. How might the motivations of Jesus followers be different in how and what we give?
- 4. As you reflect on Abel's offering in Genesis 2:4, what does it look like for you to give of your best to God?
- 5. Are there ways that your group can encourage one another towards greater generosity or even do something generous together?
